Key Vocabulary

Plague – a very infectious disease spread by fleas and rats, causing swelling, fever and usually death **Disease** – an illness of people or animals caused by an infection

Epidemic – a disease that is widespread and affects a large number of people

Contagious – spread from one person to another

Fever – a medical condition where you have a high temperature, shivers and a headache

Posies – a small bunch of flowers

Remedies - A medicine or treatment for a disease or injury

Fleas – small jumping insects that feed on the blood of animals and humans

Quarantine - isolation because of a disease

Population – all of the people who live in an area

Symptom – a physical feature indicating a disease or illness
