### Reading books

It is wonderful to see the children enjoying their reading books. I will continue to change them when returned with a comment/signature to indicate your child has read their book and is ready for a new one. I encourage all the children to read daily whether this is reading a few pages or asking questions about their book to develop their comprehension skills. The books are all phonetical using the sounds we have learnt. Please encourage your child to segment (sound out) and blend (join sounds) each word together. Please also encourage fluency as they become confident readers.

#### <u>Coats</u>

As we approach winter, please can I ask that your child has a coat in school every day. Please can I encourage the children to try and learn how to zip up their coat. If you wish for your child to have a hat, gloves and scarf as well, please ensure they are named and small enough to fit in their tray.

#### Nativity

We are starting to practice our nativity and have written our performance dates in the diary. We have decided to complete both performances on one day this year due to the way our holidays fall. There will be more details about our performances nearer the time but keep Monday  $12^{th}$  December clear so that you can come and watch your child. You will also have the opportunity for DVD purchases providing all parents give permission.

## Christmas Film Night

On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December, 3.30pm-5.30pm, the children can stay in school for a Christmas film evening. This is being organised by our PTFA instead of a Christmas disco. As part of this evening, the children can design and make a sleigh to sit in and watch the film. A few years ago, we introduced this idea and the children had great fun making a sleigh and bringing it into school. We have a few rules however to keep everyone as safe as possible. We would like the sleighs to be cardboard box size (fruit/vegetable box) if possible, for just your child to sit in.
