forgiveness	In the Bible: God's promise not to count our sins against us. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To stop blaming or being angry with someone for something that person has done, or not punish them for something
temptation	In the Bible: anything that influences you to disobey God. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The wish to do or have something that you know you should not do or have
